	The first half of the gospel (Ch. 1-8) depicts the Galilean ministry of Jesus. He gathers
	disciples, works many miracles and shows Himself to be the Messiah. Yet His
	messianic identity is to remain a secret until his triumphal entry into Jerusalem.
	The second half of the gospel depicts only a week's worth of time, but what a week it
	is! Jesus enters the Temple to the people's acclamation; He teaches and heals. Then
	He institutes the Holy Communion during the Passover meal, is arrested, tried, tortured
	and crucified. He rises on the third day as He had predicted and astonishes the
	disciples.
