Lesson Title:	The New Testament Book of Mark
	Continue your Old Testament Wall display by hanging the "Mark" wall card.
Scripture Reference(s):	Mark 3:14 And he appointed twelve, whom he also named apostles, to be with Him,
	and to be sent out to proclaim the message,
	Mark 6:7 He called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave
	them authority over the unclean spirits.
-	DISCIPLESHIP - a student who spreads the teaching of another. Every person who believes in Jesus is called His disciple. Each Sunday we are learning to be disciples of Jesus.
Introducing the Story:	(Hang your "MARK" slip under your "Books of the New Testament" wall display.)
	SAY: Mark is the shortest and most action-packed gospel. The story starts with
curriocitu)	enthusiasm as John the Baptist preaches in the wilderness. John then baptizes Jesus
	and the heavens are opened at the sound of the Father's voice. Mark takes us from
	scene to scene, healing to healing, miracle to miracle and the gospel of Mark
	shares them all!
	SAY : Can anyone share with me a miracle that they can remember that Jesus
	performed? (pause for responses) I'm pretty sure we can find each of those stories in
	the gospel of Mark. What an exciting book in the Bible!
	the gosper of Mark. What all exciting book in the bible:
	The first half of the gospel (Ch. 1-8) discusses the ministry and teachings of Jesus. He
	gathers disciples, works many miracles and shows Himself to be the Messiah, which is
	finally revealed at his triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We know this day as Palm
	Sunday!
	The second half of the gospel of Mark (Ch. 9-16) depicts only a week's worth of time,
	but what a week it is! Jesus teaches, heals, institutes the Holy Communion during the
	Passover meal, is arrested, tried, tortured and crucified. He rises on the third day as
	He had predicted and astonishes the disciples.
	SAY: When we refer to "Jesus' ministry," we mean where He travelled to preach,
	teach, heal, and perform miracles. Let's follow on a map the path Jesus took on his
	ministry.
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	SHOW/DRAW ON MAP: Using the "Map of Jesus' Travels," (to follow) and a
	highlighter or Sharpie marker, show the storyline of Mark:
	Begins on the banks of the River Jordan in the wilderness
	Moves into Galilee
	Then to Jericho
	 Then to Jerusalem, where Jesus' identity is fully revealed as Messiah,
	Suffering Servant and Divine Lord.
LESSON: Telling the	SAY: An extremely important theme in Mark's gospel is discipleship. Discipleship

Review: (Solidify learning by repeating. facts or themes or even the story itself through games, crafts, activities, or visual aids.)	The central spiritual message of the gospel of Mark is the <u>life of Jesus.</u> Jesus calls His followers to become faithful disciples who will "carry their crosses" (8:34). Each of us who believes in Jesus is called His disciple. We are carrying on Jesus' work by being together in Sunday school, learning His teachings on Sunday, and practicing what we learn during the week!
